Not all expensive skins are rare, and not all rare skins are costly. However, true rarity in the Counter-Strike universe is generally dictated by a combination of specific elements:



1. **Case Drop Rates:** The vast majority of unusual skins come from weapon cases that are no longer actively dropping in-game. As the supply dwindles, rates increase.
2. **Drift Value and Wear:** Weapons drop with differing levels of wear, ranging from Factory New to Battle-Scarred. Some skins look significantly various or distinctively desirable at severe float worths (e.g., exceptionally high floats that make the skin look greatly rusted).

1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most popular skin in the game, the Dragon Lore features a mythical dragon breathing fire throughout the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped solely on particular maps like Cobblestone during major competitions, these keepsake bundles are now exceptionally unusual. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by superstar player Skadoodle famously sold for over £ 60,000 years back, and costs have only intensified since.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is reasonably cost effective, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover nearly the whole leading receiver of the weapon in a beautiful, reflective blue. Since the chances of unboxing this precise pattern with a good float value are astronomically low, these items have commanded private deals going beyond six figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Groan

The Howl is special due to the fact that it holds historical significance. Valve eliminated the initial artwork due to a copyright infringement claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve upgraded the style and stopped it from dropping totally. Anyone holding a Howl at that time kept it, developing a cs2skin.com completely capped supply.

Aspects Influencing the marketplace
