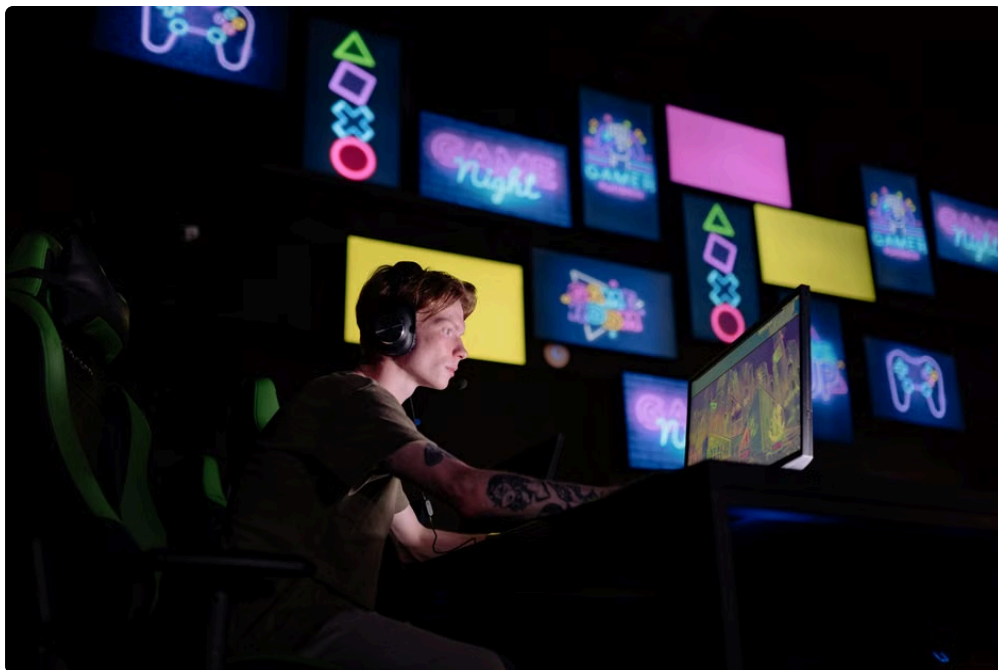
These design worlds distinguish individual games within crowded app stores and help players form emotional connections that encourage repeated play sessions.
