- **Scrap:** The primary currency of *Rust*. Utilized at Research Tables to open plans and at Outpost/Bandit Camp vending devices to buy high-tier items.

2. Weapons and Combat Gear

Fight is the beating heart of *Rust*. Gamers advance from primitive bone clubs to devastating military-grade assault rifles.

- **Primitive Tier:** Bows, crossbows, machetes, and waterpipe shotguns. Highly efficient in the early hours of a wipe.
- **Mid Tier:** Custom SMGs, Thompson submachine weapons, and semi-automatic rifles (SARs). These are the workhorses of mid-game PvP and monument raiding.
- **Endgame Tier:** Assault Rifles (LR-300 and AK), Bolt Action Rifles, and M92 Pistols, matched with heavy Metal Armor sets.

Quick Reference: Top-Tier Weapon Statistics

For players wanting to enhance their loadouts for PvP encounters, comprehending weapon statistics is essential. Below is a relative table of a few of the most popular firearms in *Rust*.

Weapon Name	Damage (Body)	Rate of Fire (RPM)	Ammo Type	Efficient Range
Attack Rifle (AK)	50	450	5.56 mm	Long
Semi-Automatic Rifle (SAR)	40	320	5.56 mm	Medium-Long
Customized SMG	30	600	Pistol Bullet	Short-Medium
Pump Shotgun	Varies (Pellets)	60	12 Gauge	Brief
Bolt Action Rifle	80	60	5.56 mm	Extreme

Keep in mind: Damage values can change based on target armor tier, distance falloff, and bullet type (e.g., High Velocity vs. Incendiary).

Navigating the Tech Tree and Crafting

One of the most complex aspects of *Rust* is the Research and Crafting system. Gone are the days when players could craft anything immediately upon leveling up. Rather, players should use the **Research Table** and **Workbenches (Tier 1, Tier 2, and Tier 3)**.

How to Unlock Items Effectively:

1. **Find or Buy the Item:** Loot it from a military dog crate, elite tier crate, or purchase it from a safe zone supplier.
2. **Bring it Home Safely:** Transport the item to base without getting ambushed by rival gamers.
3. **Research study:** Place the item on a Research Table along with the required quantity of **Scrap** to learn its plan permanently.
4. **Open through Tech Tree:** Alternatively, players can spend scrap directly on a Workbench Tech Tree to open items sequentially without requiring the physical item initially.

The Economics of Recycling

A massive feature in-depth extensively in the Rust Items Wiki is the **Recycler**, discovered most notably at monuments like the Supermarket, Oxum's Gas Station, and the Outpost. Dropping surplus components into a recycler breaks them down into basic materials and, most importantly, **scrap**.

- **Elements with High Scrap Yields:**
 - **Tech Trash:** Yields state-of-the-art elements, computer systems, and valuable scrap.
 - **Metal Pipes & Metal Springs:** Essential for crafting mid-to-high-tier weapons and armor without relying completely on random drops.
 - **Road Signs & Gears:** Crucial for upgrading primitive armor into Road Sign armor sets.

Tips for Using the Rust Items Wiki Efficiently

To get the most out of the wiki throughout a high-stakes video gaming session, keep these finest practices in mind:

- **Check the Version History:** *Rust* updates on the first Thursday of every month. Ensure the wiki page you read reflects the most current spot notes, as recoil patterns, crafting costs, and item statistics frequently change.
- **Use Search Filters:** Instead of searching aimlessly, use targeted search terms like "*High Quality Metal upkeep cost*" or "*C4 crafting requirements*" to get instantaneous answers.
- **Study Monument Loot Tables:** Cross-reference the wiki with monolith maps to find out which locations (such as the Oil Rig, Cargo Ship, or Launch Site) offer the highest-tier item drops.

Rust is a video game that penalizes lack of knowledge and rewards preparation. Whether you are trying to compute the specific amount of Explosive Ammunition required to break through a sheet metal door, or finding out how to wire an automated turrets system using electrical energy elements, knowledge is your greatest guard.
