

Garage door repair cost in Los Angeles varies according to the problem, door size, material, access, and whether replacement parts are required. A minor adjustment may cost far less than replacing a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, garage door opener, or an entire overhead garage door.

For many homeowners, a typical repair falls somewhere between \$150 and \$600, while a full garage door replacement can range from approximately \$900 to more than \$5,000, depending on the design and installation requirements.
