Case Opening	Mimics the in-game case opening experience, but typically on third-party sites with custom-curated odds and higher-tier benefit pools. Exceptionally variable; usually favors your house greatly.	
Coinflip	A simple 1v1 PvP game where 2 gamers wager skins of approximately equal value. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the entire pot. 50/50 chances, minus a little platform commission (rake).	
Prize	Multiple gamers contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's worth determines the gamer's "ticket" share. A spinner chooses one winner who takes whatever. Based upon the overall value contributed; platform takes a portion charge.
