Use this series:

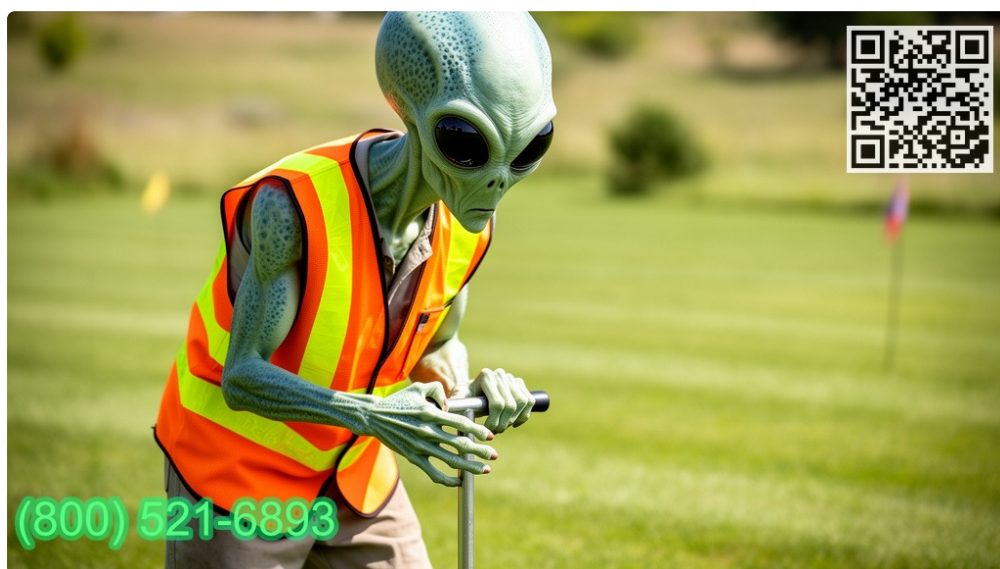
1. Locate the building sewage system departure or exterior cleanout.
