1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the video game crash to desktop (CTD) calmly, or does it show a specific mistake code (like engine.dll or memory allotment errors)?
2. **Check System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will immediately throttle or shut down procedures to prevent permanent hardware damage.
3. **Validate Recent Changes:** Did the crash start taking place right away after a Windows upgrade, a graphics driver upgrade, or the installation of new peripherals?

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

3. Change Launch Options

4. Disable Fullscreen Optimizations

- **Action 1:** Navigate to the video game installation directory site (usually C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Action 2:** Locate the main executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Step 3:** Right-click the file and select **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check package for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.

- **Action 6:** Click *Apply* and *OKAY*.

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard software fixes fail to solve the crashing concern, the problem might lie deeper within the operating system or hardware setup.

Managing Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive players overclock their hardware to eke out [check here](#) every last frame per second (FPS). However, source engines can be infamously sensitive to unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied via MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, revert the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to test stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can trigger unforeseen video game crashes and memory read mistakes. Attempt disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS briefly to see if crashes continue.

Running as Administrator

Permissions concerns can periodically avoid the game from writing needed cache files to the storage drive.



- Locate csgo.exe, right-click it, select **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and examine **Run this program as an administrator**.

Re-installing the Game

As a last option, a tidy reinstallation makes sure that no recurring conflicting files from old updates stay. Uninstall the video game through Steam, manually erase any staying folders in the steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory, and download a fresh copy.
