1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most famous skin in the video game, the Dragon Lore includes a mythical dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Initially dropped specifically on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout major competitions, these memento packages are now exceptionally unusual. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star gamer Skaddoodle famously cost over £ 60,000 years ago, and costs have just intensified considering that.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a standard Case Hardened AK-47 is relatively affordable, the top-tier pattern indices-- particularly Pattern 661-- cover nearly the whole top receiver of the gun in a beautiful, reflective blue. Due to the fact that the chances of unboxing this precise pattern with a good float worth are astronomically low, these items have actually commanded private deals surpassing 6 figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Wail

The Howl is unique since it holds historical significance. Valve got rid of the initial artwork due to a copyright infringement claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve upgraded the design and stopped it from dropping totally. Anyone holding a Howl at that time kept it, producing a completely capped supply.
