Notable Recent and Classic Cases

- **The Active Drop Pool vs. Rare Drop Pool:** When a case is moved to the "Rare Drop Pool" (stopped active drop), its supply stops increasing organically. Consequently, as players open them with time, the staying supply diminishes, and the price of the case often skyrockets.
- **Float Values and Wear:** Every skin is appointed a float worth ranging from 0.00 to 1.00, identifying its condition (Factory New, Minimal Wear, Field-Tested, Well-Worn, and Battle-Scarred).
- **The Trade-Up Contract:** Players can trade ten skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next greater tier, supplying a secondary usage for undesirable, low-tier case drops.

Can I still open CS: GO cases in Counter-Strike 2?

How do I get cases totally free?

Players can make passive case drops merely by using authorities or neighborhood servers with VAC protected. Weekly care packages normally permit players to select particular products, including active-pool weapon cases, just by leveling up their profile once each week.
