Originally dropped exclusively on particular maps like Cobblestone throughout significant competitions, these keepsake bundles are now exceptionally rare. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by superstar gamer Skadoodle notoriously cost over £ 60,000 years earlier, and prices have actually just escalated since.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")

While a basic Case Hardened AK-47 is reasonably inexpensive, the top-tier pattern indices-- specifically Pattern 661-- cover practically the whole leading receiver of the gun in a pristine, reflective blue. Because the chances of unpacking this specific pattern with an excellent float worth are astronomically low, these products have commanded personal offers surpassing six figures.

3. StatTrak™ M4A4|Howl

The Howl is unique because it holds historic significance. Valve eliminated the initial art work due to a copyright infringement claim, making the skin "Contraband." Valve upgraded the design and stopped it from dropping completely. Anyone holding a Howl at that time kept it, producing a permanently topped supply.
