

A cracked windshield has a way of turning an ordinary drive into a small expedition. One minute you are rolling down Market Street, heading across Greensboro, or lining up a weekend run toward Charlotte or Columbia, and the next minute a stone snaps off a truck tire and leaves a bright little star in the glass. It looks harmless at first. Then the sun hits it. Then the temperature drops overnight. By morning, that chip has stretched into a wandering crack, and your windshield has become the one part of the vehicle you cannot ignore.

That is where mobile windshield replacement earns its reputation.
